

A Benefit of Multisyllable Word Study

Students will begin to recognize common syllable chunks <u>before</u> they know what the word is. This helps speed the process of decoding and leads to great accuracy and fluency. <u>Ideas</u>

The student can:

- Work on 5 or 10 slips, study the words and bring them to a teach for a "pop quiz;"
- Read the word and put it in a sentence;
- Work on 5 or 10 slips and prepare for a spelling quiz.
- Ask another student a question, the answer to which is the 'mystery" word on the slip.

The teacher can:

- Focus on the words as new vocabulary;
- Focus on the syllable type and discuss why a vowel is saying it's sound or why a consonant must be placed in a particular syllable frame;
- Laminate the word study slips and provide dry-erase markers to create a non-consumable, reusable material.

<u>Note</u>

C-le teams are found only at the ends of words. A double consonant often but not always—occurs when a **C-le** syllable is combined with a closed syllable (bubble, simple). If a **C-le** syllable is combined with an open syllable (cable, cradle), there will <u>not</u> be a double consonant.
