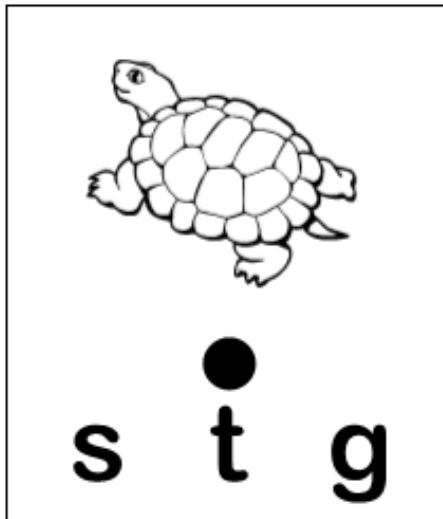


## #210 BEGINNING SOUNDS & LETTERS

### Instructions

The child must be able to isolate the beginning sound of the picture. Then he places a game piece or bingo chip in the circle above the correct letter. This game is meant to be played by a child who has some degree of letter mastery. I suggest that students master a set of 5 or 6 letters (by sound) and then move on to a second set, and then a third and a fourth, etc. These *Beginning Sounds & Letter Cards* would then be divided according to this sequence of letter sets. Thus, after a child has shown mastery of a particular set of letters, he has a corresponding set



of *Beginning Sounds & Letter Cards* with which to practice his letter recognition. Remember, accuracy of letter recognition is not enough. We must help children gain fluency and speed of letter recognition. This happens naturally with self-directed repetition of a fun game like

*Beginning Sounds & Letters.*
